

# Cognition Stations

## Step Up:

- 6 stations that will last about 10 minutes each (should take roughly one hour)
- 1 final destination that all students will do at the same time (should complete in the remainder of the period)

## Goal:

At each station students will either be taking up a creativity activity or a problem solving activity. They will have 2 tasks at each station: 1) complete the activity; 2) apply it to concepts from the unit. They must read the directions upon arrival to the station and then they will have 5 minutes to complete the activity. After the 5 minutes has expired, they must look at the "Apply This" paper at their station. The "Apply This" paper will ask the students to take what they have done at the station and apply it to a term or concept from the Cognition unit. Students should have already read this unit and should have taken notes on the reading (students will be asked to take these notes or their books with them to the stations). The student may use their notes or their phones to access the prezzi notes if they need help with the terms or concepts.

### Station 1: "The Proper Way"

**Directions:** You are at "The Proper Way." Here you will work individually. You will develop whatever you personally feel is the *best* way to do certain tasks. You will have to complete the task yourself; in the way you feel it is best. Then, you must write a thorough step-by-step process that someone else would be able to follow. This must be done in the first 5 minutes of the 10 minute period.

#### Tasks to Complete:

- 1) The BEST way to eat an oreo, from start to finish (how do you hold it, what parts do you eat first, in what way/order do you eat the parts, how many times should you chew eat bite, etc.)
- 2) The BEST way to make a paper airplane, from start to finish (what is the best paper, what folds do you make where and when, etc.)
- 3) The BEST way to toss a paper airplane, from start to finish (what is your target, how far away is your target, how do you position your hand and arm, how is the toss performed, etc.)

**Apply This:** Explain the meaning of the psychology term, algorithm. Then, explain how these activities relate to this concept. This will be done in the second 5 minutes of the 10 minutes period.

### Station 2: "Solving Life's Every Day Problems: Reinventing the Role of the Roll"

**Directions:** You are at "Solving Life's Everyday Problems." Here you will work together as a group to reinvent the *Role of the Roll*. Each person must generate as many ideas as possible to help the team come up with at least 30 ways a roll of toilet paper (and all/part of its contents) could solve life's everyday problems. Keep in mind, these must all be problems that a roll of toilet paper was not originally designed to do and is not currently being used for. These must be new, innovative, unique, and fresh ideas for the toilet paper roll. This must be done in the first 5 minutes of the 10 minute period.

**Apply This:** Explain the meaning of the psychology concept of creativity. Then, explain how this activity relates to this term. This will be done in the second 5 minutes of the 10 minutes period.

### Station 3: The Tallest Tower

**Directions:** You are at "The Tallest Tower." Here you will work individually to create a tower that is taller than the rest of your teammates. Have you done a task similar to this before? If so, be careful your previous ideas may help or hinder your ability to make a tower that is taller than your other teammates.

You will only have 10 sheets of paper and NO more. You will not be able to get new sheets if you change your mind or make a mistake, so be wise with your materials. Finally, be sure that your tower is free standing. You will have 4 minutes. After the 4 minutes, you must take 1 final minute to compare your towers and determine the winner. This must be done in the first 5 minutes of the 10 minute period.

**Apply This:** Choose at least 2 of the following words to explain how you constructed your tower (be sure that the words are defined within your explanation). This will be done in the second 5 minutes of the 10 minutes period.

- Insight

#### **Station 4: "Sing with Me"**

**Directions:** You are at "Sing with Me." Here you will work individually to decode the Christmas Titles from the cryptic messages. Complete as many as you can within 4 minutes. After the 4 minutes expires, take the final minute to go over the answers with your teammates. If you and your group would rather not see the answers so that you can do any of your uncompleted puzzles after class, which is something you are welcome to do. Just be sure to discuss this with your group. This must be done in the first 5 minutes of the 10 minute period.

**Apply This:** Indicate which 2 of the 3 vocabulary words related the most to your experience decoding the puzzles. Use the words to explain what happened during your problem solving and be sure to define the meaning of each word. This will be done in the second 5 minutes of the 10 minutes period.

#### **Station 5: "This, This, This, That"**

**Directions:** You are at "This, This, This, That." Here you will work individually to decode the puzzles on the worksheet labeled, Remote Associations. You will see three words that all have one connection. Your job is to figure out what connects the three seemingly random words. After the 4 minutes expires, take the final minute to go over the answers with your teammates. If you and your group would rather not see the answers so that you can do any of your uncompleted puzzles after class, which is something you are welcome to do. Just be sure to discuss this with your group. This must be done in the first 5 minutes of the 10 minute period.

**Apply This:** Explain the terms convergent and divergent thinking and which of the two concepts best relates to the task you were asked to complete at "This, This, This, That." This will be done in the second 5 minutes of the 10 minutes period.

#### **Station 6: "Break it Down"**

**Directions:** You are at "Break it Down." Here you will work individually to answer a series of puzzling questions. These questions must be answered with a word that sounds like a double letter pair. For every question, be sure to write both the word that answers the question and the two letters that the word can be broken down into. After the 4 minutes expires, take the final minute to go over the answers with your teammates. If you and your group would rather not see the answers so that you can do any of your uncompleted puzzles after class, which is something you are welcome to do. Just be sure to discuss this with your group. This must be done in the first 5 minutes of the 10 minute period.

**Apply This:** Explain the language terms: phoneme and morpheme. Choose 5 of the words that were answers to the questions given on this worksheet. Write each of the 3 answers you chose and explain if that word contains phonemes, morphemes, or both and indicate what parts of the word make them up. This will be done in the second 5 minutes of the 10 minutes period.

**Station 7: “Logic Puzzles”**

**Directions:** You are at “Logic Puzzles.” Here you will work individually to interpret a series of puzzling word problems. Each logic puzzle represents a common word or phrase. Complete as many of the logic puzzles as possible in the time given. After the 4 minutes expires, take the final minute to go over the answers with your teammates. If you and your group would rather not see the answers so that you can do any of your uncompleted puzzles after class, which is something you are welcome to do. Just be sure to discuss this with your group. This must be done in the first 5 minutes of the 10 minute period.

**Apply This:** Explain the term “insight” and how it relates to problem solving. Then, tell which 2 puzzles your insight happened most quickly and which 2 of your completed puzzles took longer for insight to set in. This will be done in the second 5 minutes of the 10 minutes period.

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**Apply This:** Explain the term "insight" and how it relates to problem solving. Then, tell which 2 puzzles your insight happened most quickly and which 2 of your completed puzzles took longer for insight to set in.

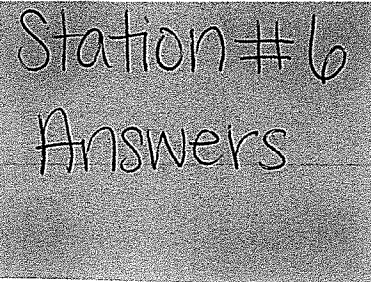
